GUNFIRE

Deputy Sheriff Daniel A. McCartney (Pierce County, Washington, Sheriff's Department) was shot and killed after **responding to a burglary in progress**, at approximately 11:30 pm. Deputy McCartney was the first officer on scene and became engaged in a foot pursuit of at least one subject. The man opened fire on Deputy McCartney during the foot pursuit, mortally wounding him. Deputy McCartney was transported to St. Joseph Medical Center where he passed away. One subject was found dead at the scene. A second subject was arrested the following day after a massive manhunt.

Detective Michael R. Doty (York County, South Carolina, Sheriff's Office) succumbed to gunshot wounds sustained the previous day while **searching for a subject who had shot a York County Sheriff's canine handler earlier** in the night. Deputies had originally responded to a domestic disturbance at which a man had attacked his wife before fleeing into a wooded area near his home. The man ambushed a canine officer who was attempting to locate him, wounding him. Following the wounding of the canine officer, a SWAT team responded to the scene to continue searching for the man. **The man setup a second ambush**, wounding Detective Doty and two other members of the SWAT team before being shot and wounded. Detective Doty was flown to a hospital in Charlotte, North Carolina, where he died the following day.

Deputy U.S. Marshal Christopher David Hill (United States Department of Justice – United States Marshals Service, U.S. Government) was shot and killed in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania while **attempting to serve an arrest warrant** with other members of the Middle Pennsylvania Fugitive Task Force. The task force had located a woman, who was wanted for making terroristic threats. As they attempted to take the woman into custody a man inside the home opened fire on them, striking Deputy Marshal Hill and two local task force officers. One of the wounded officers was able to return fire and killed the subject. Deputy Marshal Hill was transported to a local hospital where he succumbed to his wounds.

Deputy Sheriff Heath McDonald Gumm (Adams County, Colorado, Sheriff's Office) was shot and killed during a foot pursuit. Deputies had **responded to an assault in progress call** and became involved in the foot pursuit with one of the subjects. The man ran behind a house and as Deputy Gumm ran behind the house he was shot by the subject and struck in the chest. The subject was apprehended and charged with murder of a peace officer and two additional counts of murder.

Officer Glenn Anthony Doss, Jr., (Detroit, Michigan, Police Department) succumbed to a gunshot wound sustained four days earlier while **responding to a domestic violence call**. Before officers arrived on scene the male subject exited the home with a firearm. As Officer Doss and his partner arrived at the location the man opened fire on their patrol car, striking Officer Doss in the head. His partner transported him to Detroit Receiving Hospital where he underwent surgery. The subject barricaded himself inside of the home for approximately four hours until being taken into custody by the SWAT team. Officer Doss passed away from his injuries on January 28, 2018.

AUTOMOBILE CRASH

Officer Chris Beaudion (Monroe, Louisiana, Police Department) was killed in a single vehicle crash at approximately 3:00 am. His **patrol car left the roadway and struck a tree**, causing him to suffer fatal injuries.

VEHICULAR ASSAULT

Lieutenant Christopher Robateau (Jersey City, New Jersey, Police Department) was struck and killed by a vehicle while checking on the welfare of another driver who had been involved in an accident on the New Jersey Turnpike. Lieutenant Robateau, who was in uniform on his way to work shortly after 6:30 am, had exited his vehicle and was **walking toward the accident scene when another vehicle fatally struck him**.

9/11 RELATED ILLNESS

Trooper Michael J. Anson (New York State Police) died as the result of **cancer** that he **developed** following his assignment to the **search and recovery efforts at the World Trade Center** site following the 9/11 Terrorist Attacks.

Lieutenant Jeffrey W. Francis (New York City, New York, Police Department) died as the result of **cancer** that he **developed** following his assignment to assist with **search and rescue efforts at the World Trade Center** site immediately following the 9/11 Terrorist Attacks.
