As the director of IACP Programs, Domingo Herraiz's responsibilities include oversight of the Association's work in the areas of highway safety, technology, mental health, children and youth, criminal justice system reform, countering violent extremism, crime and victimization, police administration, data and information sharing, crime prevention, and police research.

Mr. Herraiz has more than 30 years of government and public safety experience in dealing with local, state, and federal policies. Prior to joining IACP, he served as the Vice President for North America Government Affairs at Motorola, responsible for public policy, government relations, and funding in the United States and Canada.

Before joining Motorola, he served as the presidentially appointed, U.S. Senate-confirmed director of the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), leading the DOJ's largest funding and policy unit for state, local, and tribal criminal justice issues. Prior to his role as director of the BJA, Mr. Herraiz served on the Ohio Governor's cabinet as the director of Criminal Justice Services. He also served as the director for the Ohio Crime Prevention Association.
