Located in Oregon, Beaverton Police Department (BPD) serves the Beaverton community with a population of 83,500 residing on 18.6 square miles. 12% of the population is Hispanic and 13% is Asian. They have experienced a 10.7% population growth rate since 2000. The community has a stable crime rate and strong community and financial support for the police department. Dispatch services are provided by a separate county-wide agency. BPD has long-term, strong working relationships with several service providers, schools, community leaders, and local and state elected officials.

Located in North Carolina, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department (CMPD) serves the city of Charlotte and most of Mecklenburg County. With a population of over 715,000, Charlotte-Mecklenburg is the 5th largest urban region, residing on 450 square miles. They have experienced a growing Hispanic population, and as the 2nd largest banking center in the U.S., the Charlotte-Mecklenburg area has also experienced a 19% population growth since 2000. They are facing challenges of maintaining relationship with schools and enhancing public understanding of criminal justice system. However, CMPD has both formal and informal working relationships with many public and private agencies.

Located in Denver, Colorado, the Denver Police Department (DPD) serves 153.35 square miles of the city and county of Denver and a resident population of approximately 588,349 with a daily swell of roughly 300,000 additional commuters. Since 1990, the population of the metro area has increased by approximately 30%, while DPD's sworn staffing level has only increased by 13%. Denver is a hub of a metropolitan area of approximately 2.6 million people. It is the largest city in a 600 mile radius and ranked as the 25th largest city and 15th largest metro-area in the U.S. DPD maintains strong collaborative relationships with over 35 unique victim service providers and agencies and has a dedicated Victim Assistance Unit of over 20 years.

The population growth rate has increased nearly 60% since 2000, making it the 4th fastest growing county in the nation. LCSO is the largest full-service Sheriff's Office in Virginia and handles major violent crimes for three smaller police departments within the county. Loudoun County has experienced a drop in crime rate for 5 straight years before a slight rise in 2007. LCSO maintains strong formal and informal working relationships with various victim service providers within private and public agencies.

New York State Police (NYSP) covers the State of New York with a population of approximately 19.3 million. It is the only police agency available in rural areas of the state. Elsewhere they share policing responsibilities with county sheriffs and local police agencies. The validation phase was conducted in Troop F. While crime is decreasing in a large part of the state, small cities have seen an increase in violent crime. "Operation Impact" has been created to target specific crimes in small cities. State troopers pair with local police officers to patrol in those cities, addressing the target crimes. NYSP maintains good working relationships with crime victim providers and employs a full time non-sworn member in each Troop as a Crime Victim Specialist to coordinate with victim providers.

Located in the greater Seattle-Tacoma metropolitan area, Sumner Police Department (SPD) serves approximately 9,000 people residing on 7.2 square miles. Sumner is an award-winning planned community with four freeway interchanges, commuter rail station and access to two major Pacific Coast ports and was voted the best little town the Pacific Northwest has to offer. The area has experienced a large industrial growth in the north end of the city and is becoming a large transit hub for commuter rail service to Seattle and Tacoma. SPD experiences strong support from the community and elected officials, but also financial limitations due to voter-approved property tax increase initiatives, which makes balancing municipal budgets more difficult each year. SPD maintains strong working relationships with the school district, downtown and north end business associations.
