This award recognizes agencies for programs that exemplify the principles of community policing and strengthen community trust through active and inclusive community collaboration.

All law enforcement agencies are eligible to apply.

Categories

- Small Agency (1-49 sworn officers)
- Midsize Agency (50-999 sworn officers)
- Large Agency (1000+ sworn officers)

Submission Tasks:

- Contacts (Nominee, Point of Contact, Head of Agency, Nominator)
- Head of Agency Acknowledgement Letter
- Supplemental Materials (optional)

Questions:

1. Explain why this individual or agency should be selected for this award. Describe the history, impact, and innovation that make the nomination unique.
2. What were the outcomes or results? If applicable, include evidence of demonstrated success.
3. How does this submission exemplify leadership and how can others benefit from the lessons learned or best practices?
4. How is community policing disseminated to the community?
5. Is the community engaged with the police department and if so, how?
