

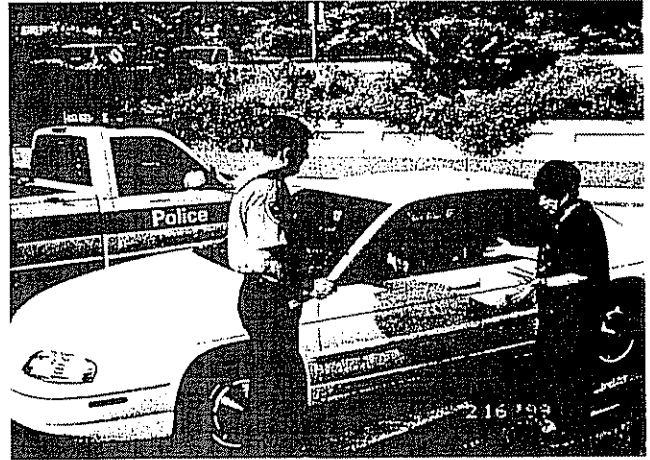
# MOTORIST SERVICE



## What is Motorist Service?

Motorist Service is a corps of uniformed civilian volunteers whose primary function is to assist stranded motorists in the City of Tempe while working closely with sworn officers.

Motorist Service Aides drive marked, full-size police trucks with "Motorist Service" markings on the doors. They wear light-blue uniform shirts with police patches on the sleeves and a volunteer patch on the front.



## Who can volunteer?

Anyone who is at least 20 years old, can commit four hours each week to Motorist Service, and can pass a polygraph can become a volunteer in Motorist Service.

## What duties do they perform?

- ♦ Assisting sworn officers at traffic accidents
- ♦ Handling found bicycle reports
- ♦ Handling calls for loose and injured animals in the roadway
- ♦ Cleaning debris from the roadway
- ♦ Writing citations for fire lane and handicapped parking violations
- ♦ Performing vehicle lock-out services when a child or an animal is locked in a vehicle
- ♦ Providing Polaroid cameras for officers
- ♦ "Red Tagging" abandoned vehicles
- ♦ Pushing vehicles from the roadway
- ♦ Providing fuel, water and air
- ♦ Jump-starting vehicles
- ♦ Changing flat tires
- ♦ Calling for a tow truck
