Just a small sample of what RSV volunteers did in one year:

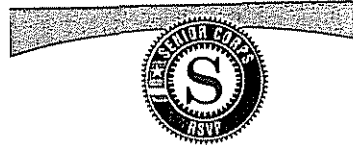
- Tutored more than 100,000 kindergarten through 12th grade students;
