- ★ contacting crime victims about case progress.
- ★ conducting criminal history checks.
- ★ department training.
- ★ enforcing handicapped parking.
- ★ reception duties.
- ★ fingerprinting.

Volunteers are assigned to work with personnel in a variety of areas, including the patrol, investigations, training and records divisions.

They may also work on special projects.

We are looking for men and women who have an interest in the work of the department. We make every effort to use the special skills and talents of our volunteers.

Program requirements

Potential volunteers must complete an application form, participate in an oral interview and undergo a criminal background check. Those selected to be volunteers must attend an orientation session, a basic training course and periodic meetings for volunteer staff.

We need volunteers who can commit at least 8 to 10 hours of their time to the police department each month, but you are welcome to commit as many hours as you can. Volunteers must follow police department policies, procedures and confidentiality requirements.
