On behalf of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) I am writing to express our strong support for the Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) Improvements Act of 2014.

Since its inception, law enforcement agencies across the nation have relied on the COPS Office Programs to expand and supplement their law enforcement capabilities. The COPS Office Programs help provide our law enforcement officers with the necessary resources to enhance public safety in our communities and to protect our homeland.

This legislation would fund critical programs to combat methamphetamine production and trafficking; to combat gun trafficking and reduce gang violence; to hire school resource officers and to establish school-based partnerships between local law enforcement agencies and local school systems to combat crime, gangs, drug activities; to hire or rehire career law enforcement officers; and for the recruitment of inactive military personnel to pursue the law enforcement profession.
