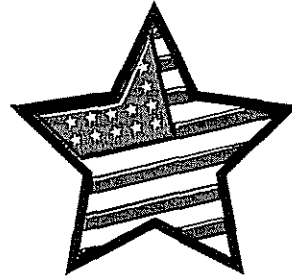

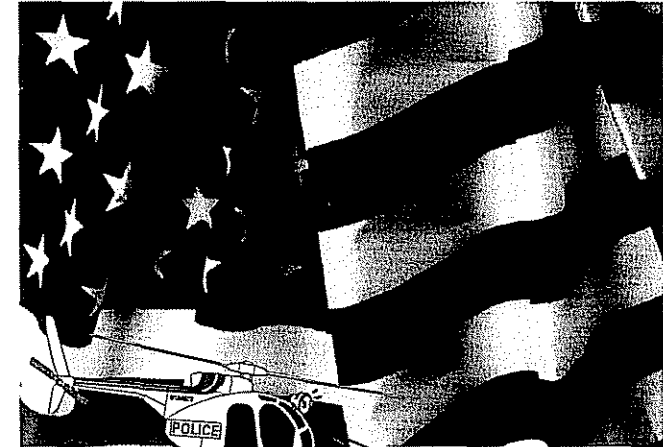

PURPOSE OF CVP'S

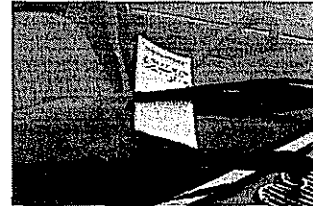
Members of the Citizen Volunteer Patrol act as "Eyes and Ears" for law enforcement, patrolling the community on a regular shift basis and communicating directly, by use of the radio, with Redlands' Dispatch Center. CVP's do not carry weapons and are encouraged to avoid physical contact. CVP's take limited enforcement action. They observe and report suspicious activities. CVP's are an excellent compliment to law enforcement.



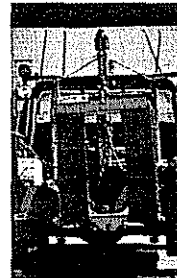
CVP's ride in teams of a least two.
