Meeting Minutes

Call to Order at 11:00AM by General Chair Margolis

Introductions & Remarks

- General Chair welcomed members and guest and introduced the Section's Regional Vice Chairs and Section Committee Chairs.
- Members were addressed by Chief Julian Fantino, IACP Oversight Vice President for the University and Police Section.
- Domingo Herraiz from US Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Assistance spoke about beginning his work in Ohio on a campus. He announced that millions of dollars for technical assistance and training would soon be available.
- Craig Floyd of the National Law Enforcement Memorial (NLEM) gave an update on the efforts to create a memorial museum in Washington, DC. The fundraising goal for the memorial is \$80 million with \$10 million coming from law enforcement. In May of 2004 Motorola pledged \$3 million and is the lead corporate sponsor. He expects to create a visual exhibit in 2005 to promote the vision for the museum. The 90,000 square feet in the 400 block of E Street, appropriated by Congress in 2000, will be developed as a principally underground museum. The scheduled ground breaking for the museum is Spring 2007 with an opening planned for Police Week in 2009. The mission of the NLEM is to promote law enforcement safety and research and function as a library repository that can tell the stories behind the 16,500 names on the memorial. Handouts and pins were provided. Support encouraged.

Section Activity Highlights

The following activities highlight some of the work, on-going and accomplished, that Section members are doing in the IACP and beyond.

- In January 2004, Vice General Chair Adam Garcia and Past-General Chair Susan Riseling represented the Section in the IACP Building Private Sector Security/Public Sector Policing Partnerships to Prevent and Respond to Terrorism and Public Disorder Conference.

- In March 2004, Chief Paul Glowacki, St. Mary's University participated on behalf of the Section in an executive assessment center for a university medical center chief's position in South Carolina.
- In April 2004, the Section co-hosted a regional conference in partnership with the International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators and the California Association of University & College Police Chiefs in Reno, NV under the leadership of Section Vice General Chair Adam Garcia, Chief of Police, University of Nevada – Reno.
- In June 2004, the Section held a successful Mid Year Meeting in Ottawa at which we hosted several international guests for the IACP including Deputy Commissioner Darrell J. LaFosse of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police; and several representatives from the London Metropolitan Police (Scotland Yard).

Training Highlights

Section members hosted IACP training across the United States. Highlights include:

Legislative Highlights

General Chair Margolis and Legislative Committee Chair Bill Taylor (Chief of Police, Rice University) and several Section members were successful in lobbying the US Congress to adopt legislation extending the same Federal benefits to law enforcement officers serving private institutions of higher education and rail carriers, which apply to law enforcement officers serving units of State and local government.

"Equity in Law Enforcement Act" was introduced in the Senate by Senator Reed of Rhode Island and co-sponsored by Senator Cornyn of Texas and Senator Leahy of Vermont. This is the legislation that the IACP College and University Police Section and the International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators (IACLEA) have worked on for several years. It allows Federal death benefits for survivors and participation in the bullet-proof body armor grants and other federal law enforcement grants by police agencies at private colleges and universities. Identical legislation was introduced into the House of Representatives by Rep. Bell

of Texas and co-sponsors, Rep. Cole of Oklahoma, Rep. Jefferson of Louisiana and Representative Cannon of Utah. This legislation will be re-introduced in the next Congress.

Lastly, the Section wrote and introduced a resolution for the 111th Annual Conference in Los Angeles that did not pass the Resolution and Legislative Committees. It did spark other conversations in the association about inclusion.

Treasurer's Report: Nancy Turner, IACP

- The Section's 2005 FY Budget was presented and approved.
- It was noted that the expenses for the General Chair and Vice Chair to travel to the annual meeting and mid-year meeting are no longer being paid for by the Section.
- The General Chair noted that the Section cannot afford to support four scholarships without obtaining sponsorship.
- Ray Thrower, as Special Projects Chair, will coordinate with IACLEA to coordinate outreach for corporate sponsorship.
- The General Chair spoke of creating opportunities for corporate sponsorship such as receptions and luncheons as well as the scholarships.

Special Projects

The General Chair acknowledged and thanked Ray Thrower for his efforts to create a line of merchandise featuring the University and College Police Section including pad-folios and polo shirts which the E Group expects to have for sale at the Annual Conference. The General Chair spoke of his efforts to address the extremely high shipping charges on the merchandise.

Committee Reports

Scholarship- Rich Pomager

Sue Riseling made a motion to amend the number of scholarships awarded from four to two-both in the amount of \$1,000. John Grela seconded the motion. It passed unanimously. It was suggested that the scholarship be expended beyond the criminal justice field of study. Rich indicated that he would seek input on changes to the guidelines through email. Ken Overholt suggested looking into ways to get information on the scholarship to parents at orientation. Paul Glowacki indicated that a member of his department had been a recipient and is now in the US Secret Service.

Committee Reports (*continued*)

Recruitment- The General Chair is seeking interested members to Chair this committee. The Section currently has 269 members of which 39 are secondary members. This is up slightly from last year's figure of 264.

Legislative- Bill Taylor

The Law Enforcement Officer Equity Act is pushing forward and the assault weapon ban is sun-setting. The Law Enforcement Safety Act (HR 218) concerning concealed carry passed but does not include private colleges and universities.

Activity Summary:

I have concentrated on two important objectives this past year. These objectives are:
