Meeting Minutes

Call to order at 12:00 Noon by General Chair Margolis

Introduction and Remarks

- General Chair welcomed members, special guests, and the Section's Regional Vice Chairs and Section Committee Chairs.
- Members were addressed by IACP sixth Vice President Jimmy Fawcett, the oversight vice president. He addressed the issue that a project to fix homeland security issues at the executive committee meetings is being worked on. There was a paper released about how to respond to terrorist attacks. All members can download it off of the internet.
- Donna Bucella of the Department of US Terrorism Screening Center addressed the group to improve the communication between university and college police departments and her organization. This communication will allow for officers to receive warnings about subjects under watch and even be walked through what to do if needed. So far, there have been 67 calls from university police and 59 of these have been positive encounters. Of those, 53 have been involved with international terrorism and 6 with domestic terrorism. If more help is needed, the FBI will take over the investigation for us. If someone is being watched in your area, your agency could or could not be notified.

- Appointed Faculty for the **IACP National Law Enforcement Leadership Institute on Violence Against Women**. First institute held in Myrtle Beach, SC in May 2005.

- **American Council on Education Campus Executive Workshop on Homeland Security Planning, Dec 2005.** The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has been actively engaged with colleges and universities to enhance their preparedness to effectively handle catastrophic events. A comprehensive strategy for enhancing campus preparedness was developed in partnership with national associations of higher education, other federal agencies, national campus law enforcement organizations, and colleges and universities. The strategy recognizes the importance of involving the executive leadership of colleges and universities in preparing for catastrophic events. Accordingly, the DHS, working through West Virginia University Virtual Medical Campus (WVU-VMC[®]), is developing a *Homeland Security Planning for Campus Executives*. Co-Sponsors of the planning meeting include: American Council on Education (ACE), The U.S. Department of Homeland Security working with West Virginia University (DHS/WVU), and the Federal Bureau of Investigation Office of Law Enforcement Coordination (FBI).

- National Law Enforcement Officer's Memorial Fund change in bylaws to include university and campus police officers on the wall (Officer James Davis, Butler University).
- IACP endorsement of the National Summit on Campus Public Safety and the concept for the National Center for Campus Public Safety.
- Interviewed by the Pittsburgh Post Gazette on the arming of campus law enforcement officers.
- Successfully lobbied the IACP Executive Committee to change to the legislative document's preamble language to properly define "state, local, and tribal" and "law enforcement." This ensured that legislators understood the scope of the demographic represented in the US by the IACP. Railroad Section Chair, John Clark, added through motion/discussion the term "law enforcement" as defined in the language that follows:

"A core strength of the IACP is the unity with which it speaks on behalf of law enforcement. In an effort towards inclusiveness and brevity in addressing the broad scope of the police family, the following demographics are implied and considered when the phrase, "state, local, and tribal" or "law enforcement" is employed. University and college; state and provincial; municipal; county; federal; Indian country; public transit; marine; railroad; environmental; military; park police; capitol police; the various special investigative branches of prosecutorial agencies; and any legislatively authorized, duly sworn and certified law enforcement agency."

- President Estey asked me to chair an ad-hoc committee on the feasibility of IACP technology based education and training (web-based; DVD; etc). The scope of our work will be to explore what is, what could be, what costs are involved, and the possibility that such education and training could count as credits towards degrees through some of our universities and colleges. Our committee will be working over the coming months to prepare this report for President Estey for the Chicago board meeting. This is a feasibility study only, and will form the foundation for future IACP leadership to carry on should the concept prove possible.
- Chief Willie Fuller, VA Commonwealth University Police Department, named as the Chair of the Recruitment and Membership Committee.
- Chief Paul Glowacki has been appointed by President Estey as the IACP University & College Police Section representative to the US DOJ Bureau of Justice Assistance Counter-Terrorism Training Coordination Working Group (CTTWG) and on the Group's subcommittee that coordinates intelligence training issues. Chief Glowacki currently holds this position for IACLEA, and will now serve both professional organizations through this dual appointment. Thanks to Paul for taking on this important assignment and representing the professionals who protects our nation's universities and colleges.
- Recent appointments of Chief Jim Perotti, Yale University Police Department, to Northatlantic Regional Chair upon the resignation of Chief Paul Verreccia (change in positions). Recent appointment of Chief Vicki Stormo, University of Washington, to the Mountain Pacific Regional Chair.
- Thanks to Chief Rich Pomager and the Scholarship Committee for selecting 2 excellent recipients for this year's scholarships.
- Reporters from the Pittsburg Post Gazette did an article on arming of campus police officers and I interviewed with them.

Vice-General Chair Report-Adam Garcia, Director-University of Nevada, Reno Police Services

Chief Garcia is in London, England studying. A full report will be presented at the annual meeting in Miami, Florida in September.

Committee Reports

Legislative Committee-William F. Taylor - Director of Public Safety, Rice University Police Dept.

- Efforts on the legislative front with regard to legislation that would extend federal benefits and grant participation to private colleges and universities have

pretty much stagnated. With the partisanship of the new Congress and last year's run with a failure to produce a strong grassroots support from individual States' Congresspersons, there has been no willingness on the part of the Senators that introduced and supported the Bill last year, to reintroduce it this year. Unless we can generate some other Congressional support, there is no point in further efforts on this legislation, no matter how logical and fair it might be.

The only other information is regarding our election process that will begin in July, once we have determined who our current members are. Nominations will begin in July and voting will take place in August/September. We will elect the Vice General Chair and all four Regional Chairs using an electronic process of e-mail and Survey Monkey. We will need e-mail addresses for all members if they want to participate.

My selection to these groups received the support of IACP and IACLEA, as I serve as the representative for colleges and universities throughout the nation on those working groups.
- Attended the Homeland Security – ODP May Training Partner Symposium held in DC. I attended the meeting as a result of my position on the Strategic Planning Subcommittee of the IACLEA Domestic Preparedness Committee. I was able to meet with federal officials, including Jeff Alison, to remind them that not to forget university/campus policing in their federal training initiatives. Most importantly, Chris Blake (IACLEA) and I made contact with ODP officials in order to remind them to make sure state homeland security officials are aware that university/campus policing officials can attend federally funded training efforts that are available throughout the nation.
- I believe many colleges and universities police agencies have not taken advantage of the federally funded training initiatives toward homeland security and domestic preparedness. It is time that we make sure that we are included in those training initiatives.
