Regional Reports

North Atlantic Region - Chief Jim Perrotti

Chief Perrotti is very hard at work to increase membership for the section. Question was asked if the campus police chief could pay dues for local Police Chief? Several comments were made regarding this issue.

South Region - Chief Paul Glowacki

January 2006 – Attended the US DOJ BJA Counter-Terrorism Training Coordination Working Group and US DOJ BJA Intelligence Training Coordination Working Group on behalf of IACP University and College Police Section.

March 2006 – Hosted a successful and unique national training event on the campus of St. Mary's University in San Antonio on Investigating and Prosecuting Terrorism (3.5 days). Over 130 federal, military, state and local law enforcement officials were in attendance from 18 states.

April 2006 – Attended the US DOJ BJA Counter-Terrorism Training Coordination Working Group and US DOJ BJA Intelligence Training Coordination Working Group on behalf of IACP University and College Police Section. Next meeting is scheduled for August 8th, 2006.

May 2006 – Attended the US DOJ Bureau of Justice Programs Symposium on Pandemic Emergency Planning for Public Health and the Criminal Justice System. This will be something that all university and police chiefs and executives must keep in mind, as this continues to develop.

North Central Region - Chief Ray Thrower

Chief Thrower has been working on recruitment and special projects for merchandise for the section. Look forward to new merchandise in Boston.

Mountain Pacific Region - Chief Ronald Levine

Chief Levine has been working on recruitment as well. He believes the California Law Enforcement education section is lacking and wants to work closer with IACP.

Committee Reports

Legislative - Chief Bill Taylor

Chief Taylor stated that the President's budget eliminated law enforcement funding. Chief Taylor spent some time in Washington and passed out IACP pamphlets and visiting with members of Congress. It seems to have made some impact. There are still inequities in the law enforcement bill and Chief Taylor has made some preliminary contacts. Private institutions police officers killed in the line of duty still do not receive the same death benefits as local, state and federal law enforcement officers.

Recruitment and Placement - Chief Michael Marzion
